Dear Parents & Carers Welcome back to the new half term. We have had such a busy first week back! Please find below our learning for this half term. Miss Firth, Mrs Cheeseman (Monday) and Mr Towriss (Monday)- Class Teachers Miss Cookland - Teaching Assistants	
ENGLISH	In English this half term, we have a mix of narrative and non-fiction units, focusing on Voice in the Park by Anthony Browne and The BFG by Roald Dahl. We will be: -Writing setting descriptions -Writing from different characters points of view -Writing our own dreams -Creating an information booklet Grammar lessons are taught by Mrs Cheeseman on a Monday morning to link with the units of writing for the half term.
MATHEMATICS	In maths this half term, we will be focusing on: -The 3, 6 and 9 times tables and the patterns and relationship between each -7 times tables and patterns -Understanding multiplicative relationships -Coordinates
SCIENCE	 Our science for this half term will complete our learning from last half term around the unit of sound: Identifying how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating and recognising that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear Finding patterns between the pitch and volume of a sound and features of the object that produced it Learning that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases We will have Sam Boffin in from Boffin Projects to do an interactive sound workshop with the children half way through the unit.
GEOGRAPHY	In Geography this half term we will be continuing to learning about the United Kingdom. Children will be able to locate and name countries of the UK, knowing which countries belong to the British Isles, Great Britain, and UK. Children will be taught about the history of the Union Flag and will be able to identify key human and physical features of the UK. Children will know capitals and key cities and understand their physical locations i.e. on rivers/estuaries.
R.E.	Our focus for this half term is all about symbolism for Christians and which symbols are important to them. We will look at the Easter story and Holy Week and the symbols that we notice.
