Below are details of the key learning your child will be experiencing this term:

ENGLISH	Text: The Tempest We will write poetry in the style of Shakespeare. Text: Macbeth We will be studying the story and then we will do some persuasive writing based on the character of Macbeth.
MATHEMATICS	We will extending our knowledge of rounding up to 8 digit numbers. We will also be looking at multiplication and division in great detail - including the written methods.
SCIENCE	Living things and their habitats: Classification systems
HISTORY	Shakespeare's Legacy
PSHE	Keeping myself safe: How our feelings can keep us safe- including online safety; Safe and unsafe touches; Medicine safety; Sleep
R.E.	How do Jews remember the Kings and Prophets in worship and life?
Computing	We will be learning about programming and using 'Python' programming language.
Art	We will be completing a unit entitled 'Make my Voice Heard'; this will involve looking at various artists who are renowned for their street art. We will then do our own piece inspired by one or all of these artists.
