Throughout the year, we have seen a significant number of pupils arriving late to school. As a result, punctuality will be a focus point for the upcoming year. The school gates open at 8:35am and the school day begins at 8:50am, this is when registration opens. Children arriving after 8:50am will receive a late mark. Registration closes at 9:20am, any children arriving after this time receive a U mark, which is classed as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's attendance levels. Each school day is made up of two sessions, any 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period will be referred to the attendance team at Bradford Council.

Please also be reminded that holidays during term time cannot be authorised. Any unauthorised absences due to holidays taken in term time will be referred to Bradford Council and a penalty notice may be issued.

We would like to say a huge thank you to all of our parents and carers who continue to support us to improve attendance across school, we appreciate your cooperation on this matter. We hope you have a lovely, restful summer and look forward to seeing you all in September.
