# PE Sports Premium Funding Plan 2025/2026

### Purpose of Funding (taken from DfE website)

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport you offer. This means that the funding provided should be used to improve the following five key areas:

- increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- offering a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- increasing participation in competitive sport

#### Funding allocation for 2025 to 2026

Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil. 210x10 = £2100 + £16,000 £18,100
