## SUMMER TERM 2 – CURRICULUM INFORMATION

 Below are details of the key learning your child will be experiencing this term.

<b>ENGLISH</b>	<p>In English we are going to be continuing to learn all about Greek Myths.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We will be writing more character descriptions, creating our own myths and legends and continuing to retell the mythological stories.</li> </ul> <p>We will also be writing our own Limericks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We will be learning what they are</li> <li>How to lay them out</li> <li>Writing them</li> <li>Performing them to our peers</li> </ul>
<b>MATHEMATICS</b>	<p>This half term, the children will be taught:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Calculating the value of the parts and wholes</li> <li>Learning about Non- unit fractions</li> <li>Adding and subtracting fractions</li> <li>Learning about parallel and perpendicular sides in polygons</li> <li>Continuing to tell the time to the nearest minute and comparing units of time</li> </ul> <p>We will be continuing to practise our TT Rock Stars and Num Bots to improve our multiplication and maths knowledge.</p>
<b>SCIENCE</b>	<p>In science this half term we are continuing to learn about forces and motion. The children will be taught through a range of investigations as well as through conducting their own research to find the answer to scientific questions. They will learn about the opposite poles of a magnet, and how these attract and repel, depending on which poles are facing. They will also learn about which materials are magnetic and non-magnetic and they will make their own compass!</p>
<b>HISTORY</b>	<p>For the rest of Summer Term we will be learning all about the legacy of the Greeks including: the Olympic Games; alphabet/literacy; architecture; democracy; theatre; mathematics. We will be using evidence from primary and secondary sources. We will be asking ourselves what artefacts can tell us about the Ancient Greeks. We will be using timelines to record key events during Ancient Greek civilisation.</p>
<b>PHSE</b>	<p><u>Growing and changing</u>          To name a few things that make a positive relationship and some things that make a negative relationship. To be able to tell you what happens to the woman's body when the egg isn't fertilised, recognising that it is the lining of the womb that comes away. To identify when someone hasn't been invited into my body space and show how to be assertive in asking them to leave it if I feel uncomfortable.</p>
<b>RE</b>	<p><u>Who can inspire us</u>          We will be exploring the concept of leadership: Jesus, The Prophet Mohammed and Moses. Key figures in the Abrahamic religions and their teachings. Characteristics of specific leaders, why they are inspirational and how they taught key elements of the faith through stories. Study modern day leaders, analysing the impact they have had on society.</p>
<b>P.E.</b>	<p>This half term, the focus is: <u>Athletics</u>          We will be mastering basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching. Developing our balance, agility and coordination.</p>
<b>MUSIC</b>	<p>The children will continue with their recorder lessons on Tuesday mornings. They will build on their previous skills taught to learn new songs and notes to perform.</p>
