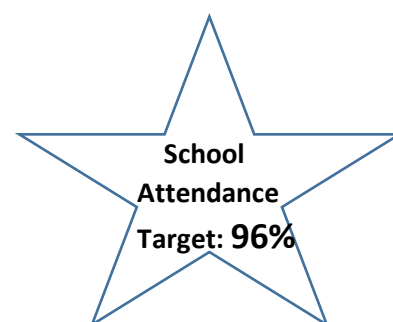
The class with highest attendance this term was... **Year 5!**

Throughout the year, we have continued to see a significant number of pupils arriving late to school, as a result, punctuality will remain a focus next year. The school gates open at 8:35am and the school day begins at 8:50am, this is when registration opens. Children arriving after 8:50am will receive a late mark. Registration closes at 9:20am, any children arriving after this time receive a U mark, which is classed as an unauthorised absence and will affect your child's attendance levels. Each school day is made up of two sessions, any 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period will be referred to the attendance team at Bradford Council.

Please also be reminded that holidays during term time cannot be authorised. Any unauthorised absences due to holidays taken in term time will be referred to Bradford Council and a penalty notice may be issued.

We would like to say a huge thank you to all of our parents and carers who continue to support us to improve attendance across school and we appreciate you working with us on this matter. We hope you have a lovely, restful summer and look forward to seeing you all in September.



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
